We need to make something for an individual that uses a wheelchair and has the use of one arm. The goal is to go turkey hunting with a shotgun. - The 3D tournaments we participate in are an excellent time to make or adjust the adaptations. Our next 3D tournament is scheduled for Saturday March 6th at Lori G's Wildwood Archery in Union Grove. Please join us and please pass this information on to others you know.
